

NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE DETERMINATION: Fulton Hogan Limited Civil Cranes at Rosedale Auckland

<u>PURSUANT TO</u> Rule Part 77 of the Civil Aviation Rules I, Sean Turangarau Kere Rogers, Manager Aeronautical Services, having received from Fulton Hogan Limited Civil, notification of intention to construct a 60 metre high crane at Rosedale, Auckland, conducted an aeronautical study in consultation with such persons, representatives and organisations as I considered appropriate.

After completing the aeronautical study, I am satisfied that the proposed action, if executed, could constitute a hazard in navigable airspace.

THEREFORE I HEREBY ISSUE a

DETERMINATION OF HAZARD IN NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE

in respect of the above notification.

The following conditions are specific to this Determination:

- The crane is to be equipped with an obstacle light located at the highest point of the crane and at the end of the crane boom, in accordance with Civil Aviation Rule Part 77, Appendix B. The lights must be operational at all times; and
- 2. Fulton Hogan Ltd Civil must coordinate with Helitranz, the operator of Rosedale Road heliport, to develop procedures that mitigate the risk to helicopters arriving and departing from the heliport. Fulton Hogan must comply with any conditions imposed by Helitranz for the safe operation of Rosedale Road heliport; and
- 3. Fulton Hogan Ltd Civil must coordinate with RNZAF Base Auckland, Whenuapai to issue a NOTAM that advises pilots of the crane operation; and
- 4. Fulton Hogan Ltd Civil must advise CAA when the crane is no longer in use and is dismantled.

This Determination of Hazard shall become final on the 6th day of August 2018 unless a petition for review is received by the Director prior to that date.

This Determination of Hazard shall not expire but may be revoked, in writing, by the Director.
