



## **NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE DETERMINATION: Smith Crane and Construction Ltd- 63 ECH and 420ECH Tower Crane at ASB CH Hospital**

PURSUANT TO Rule Part 77 of the Civil Aviation Rules I, Sean Turangarau Kere Rogers, Manager Aeronautical Services, having received from Smith Crane and Construction Ltd, notification of intention to construct and operate two tower cranes up to 98 metres above mean sea level in the vicinity of the Acute Services Building at Christchurch Hospital, conducted an aeronautical study in consultation with such persons, representatives and organisations as I considered appropriate.

After completing the aeronautical study, I am satisfied that the proposed action, if executed, would not constitute a hazard in navigable airspace.

THEREFORE I HEREBY ISSUE a

### **DETERMINATION OF NO HAZARD IN NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE**

in respect of the above notification.

The following condition is specific to this Determination:

- both cranes must be equipped with a medium intensity red obstacle light that flashes at a frequency of between 20 and 40 times per minute.

This Determination of No Hazard shall become final on 16<sup>th</sup> day of March 2016 unless a petition for review is received by the Director prior to that date.

This Determination of No Hazard shall expire on 15<sup>th</sup> day of July 2017.
