

NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE DETERMINATION: Fletcher Construction NZ & South Pacific Ltd Luffing Jib Tower Crane Saltus, Mt Wellington - Auckland City

PURSUANT TO Rule Part 77 of the Civil Aviation Rules I, Michael John Haines, Manager Aeronautical Services, having received from Fletcher Construction NZ & South Pacific Ltd, notification of intention to erect a crane in the Mt Wellington urban area of Auckland City, conducted an aeronautical study in consultation with such persons, representatives and organisations as I considered appropriate.

After completing the aeronautical study, I am satisfied that the proposed action, if executed, could constitute a hazard in navigable airspace.

THEREFORE I HEREBY ISSUE a

DETERMINATION OF HAZARD IN NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE

in respect of the above notification.

The following conditions are specific to this Determination:

1. The crane must be lit using a medium intensity light as close as practicable to the highest point of the crane in accordance with Appendix B.10 to Civil Aviation Rule 77; and
2. In accordance with CAR Part 77.15, Fletcher Construction NZ & South Pacific Ltd must:
 - a. notify the CAA of the actual commencement date of the crane; and
 - b. within five working days of when the crane reaches its greatest height, provide the CAA with proof of compliance with the lighting requirements; and
 - c. notify the CAA within 5 working days of when the crane is removed.
3. The applicant must liaise with the local Heliport Operators and inform them of their crane operation activities, the affected Heliport operators are;
 - a. Auckland Hospital
 - b. Mechanics Bay

This Determination of Hazard shall become final on 01 May 2012 unless a petition for review is received by the Director prior to that date.

This Determination of Hazard shall not expire but may be revoked, in writing, by the Director.
