

NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE DETERMINATION: Naylor Love Construction Ltd-Tower Crane Three Apartment Blocks Queenstown

<u>PURSUANT TO</u> Rule Part 77 of the Civil Aviation Rules I, Sean Turangarau Kere Rogers, Manager Aeronautical Services, having received from Naylor Love Construction Ltd, notification of intention to use a crane to construct 3 apartment buildings on a property on the corner of Cherry Blossom and Copper Beech Avenues, Queenstown, conducted an aeronautical study in consultation with such persons, representatives and organisations as I considered appropriate.

After completing the aeronautical study, I am satisfied that the proposed action, if executed, would not constitute a hazard in navigable airspace.

THEREFORE I HEREBY ISSUE a

DETERMINATION OF NO HAZARD IN NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE

in respect of the above notification.

The following condition is specific to this Determination:

- 1. The crane must be equipped with a flashing red light located at the highest available point on the crane, in accordance with CAR Part 77, Appendix B. This light must be operational at all times; and
- 2. Keep the crane below 36m above ground level at all times.
- 3. Naylor Love Construction Ltd is to notify the CAA when the crane operation is complete and removed from the site.
- 4. Naylor Love Construction Ltd is to notify the CAA 30 days prior to the expiration of this Determination requesting an extention. This will cover the remaining period of crane operations.

This Determination of No Hazard shall become final on 30 April 2019 unless a petition for review is received by the Director prior to that date.

This Determination of No Hazard shall expire on 5 October 2020.
