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Notes on use of the CAA 24047/05A Deregistration form

What is this form used for?

This form is used to request the Director within 14 days of becoming aware of the aircraft being destroyed, lost, stolen or withdrawn from use, to remove the aircraft from the New Zealand Register of Aircraft, when the holder of a certificate of registration is unavailable to request deregistration, eg, deceased or unable to be contacted.

If the holder of the certificate is available they must use form CAA 24047/05.

Who should complete this form?

The person who has authority to sign on behalf of the current owner of the aircraft.

What is the fee for deregistration of an aircraft?

There is no fee required to deregister your aircraft.

111 False statements or declarations

Every one is liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 3 years who, on any occasion on which he is required or permitted by law to make any statement or declaration before any officer or person authorised by law to take or receive it, or before any notary public to be certified by him as such notary, makes a statement or declaration that would amount to perjury if made on oath in a judicial proceeding.
