

17/EXE/28 (Amendment #1) Exemption from the Requirement in Civil Aviation Rule CAR 135.369

PURSUANT TO Section 37(2)(c) of the Civil Aviation Act 1990,

- I, Keith Manch, Director of Civil Aviation, being satisfied that—
- (a) the requirement in CAR 135.369 that a holder of an air operator certificate must ensure that each of its helicopters with a certificated seating capacity of 10 seats or more excluding any crew member seat is equipped with a flight data recorder (FDR) in accordance with paragraph B.4 of Appendix B is unreasonable in the case of the BK117 aircraft type, for which a FDR that would meet the requirement of the rule is not available; and
 - (b) the risk to safety will not be significantly increased by the granting of this exemption;

HEREBY EXEMPT—

any holder of a Part 119/135 Air Operator Certificate operating a BK117 aircraft type under the authority of the certificate;

FROM-

the requirement in CAR 135.369 that an holder of an air operator certificate must ensure that each of its helicopters with a certificated seating capacity of 10 seats or more excluding any crew member seat is equipped with a flight data recorder in accordance with paragraph B.4 of Appendix B;

ONLY WITH RESPECT TO—

all New Zealand registered Airbus Helicopters Deutschland MBB-BK117 Series and Kawasaki BK117 Series with a certificated seating capacity of 10 seats or more, excluding any crew member seat, which are operated under the authority of a Part 119/135 Air Operator Certificate;

PROVIDED THAT—

- a) the aircraft has never been fitted with a flight data recorder that meets the requirements defined in Part 135 Appendix B, paragraph B.4; and
- b) the aircraft was first issued with an Airworthiness Certificate, by an ICAO Contracting State, prior to 1 January 2016; and
- c) the aircraft is not used in air operations for the carriage of more than 9 passengers.



This exemption shall remain in effect until 30^{th} April 2027, unless withdrawn earlier in writing by the Director.
